Manufacturing plays a vital role in Middlesex County, employing nearly 16% of the workforce. Middlesex County benefits from its location in Southern Ontario's manufacturing corridor, which stretches from Oshawa to Windsor. The County's skilled workforce, entrepreneurial spirit, and easy access to world-class research facilities such as Western University and Fanshawe College create a dynamic environment for manufacturers.

Manufacturers like Armatec Survivability and ADS Pipe thrive in Middlesex County due to the region's excellent transportation routes, including access to Highways 401, 402, and rail lines. The manufacturing sector accounts for 43% of GDP exports from Middlesex County, at a total of \$2.37 billion annually. The two largest sub-sectors are Transportation Equipment Manufacturing (NAICS 336) and Food Manufacturing (NAICS 311), with annual exports of \$927 million and \$406 million, respectively. Additionally, Middlesex's low energy costs and proactive municipal governments foster a welcoming environment for businesses.
